



Home Development Training Specialist

Home Development Training Specialist conducts training activities and events to foster/adoptive parents in accordance with licensing requirements. Additionally, the Home Development Training Specialist works as the primary case manager to prospective foster and adoptive parents who want to foster or adopt children in the custody of DFPS and is responsible for completion of all aspects of the verification process.

Responsibilities Include:

- Conducts training activities in foster home and in the office to include but not limited to Foster Parent Pre-Service, Trauma Informed Care, CPR, First Aid, MANDT, and other topic trainings.
- Assists in planning, organizing, developing and designing training and educational programs using acceptable, innovative methods and techniques or style.
- Assists with researching, writing, and creating new training and instructional materials, teaching aids (audio and visual), and other course materials.
- Ensures every aspect of training has a Trauma Informed focus.
- Seeks ways to integrate a culture of excellence at each training presentation.
- Provides feedback to Directors, Leads, and Home Development staff related to foster parent's performance in training.
- Serve as the primary case manager for families assigned to during the home development process.
- Work directly with and assess the strengths/needs of families who have applied to be foster and adoptive parents.
- Maintain the family files, documents and training records and ensure they are following licensing standards and agency policies and procedures.
- Complete home visits and necessary interviews, background checks, and due diligence in evaluation a family for fitness.
- Complete prospective family home studies and collect all pertinent information. Home studies should be complete in 30 days or less.
- Present all supporting documentation and case records for feedback, revisions and approval to complete family home studies within 30 days of conducting final interview.
- Documentation of all home visits and client contacts by the 5th day of each month.
- Verify foster, foster/adopt, adopt, respite or kinship families per month, on an average of 90 days from family beginning Pre-service training.

Requirements:

- Requires Bachelor's Degree in education, social work, communications, public relations or social service-related field. BSW or MSW preferred.
- 1-year previous Home Development experience or 2 years' experience as a Foster Care Specialist or case manager for child placing agency.
- Ability to make effective presentations to an audience, to include providing instruction and training for Pre-Service training or public speaking for professional engagements.
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills to allow for effective interviewing and proficient home study completion.
- Must have a working knowledge of Minimum Standards for Child Placing Agencies.
- Skilled in organizing work in a responsible way in an environment with multiple challenges and priorities.
- Knowledgeable of cultural diversity and able to provide culturally competent service to children and adults.
- Ability to seek supervision and use it constructively.

- Must be at least 21 years old and must perform with emotional maturity and stability.
- Must maintain a current drivers' license and auto insurance. Must have access to reliable and safe transportation. Willingness and ability to use personal vehicle for work activities.
- Must work independently, be flexible, multi-task oriented, and be comfortable engaging in grassroots efforts, conducting cold calls, and other marketing interception activities to facilitate lead generation prospects for foster families.
